Dear Chairman Bonilla and Ranking Member Kaptur:


We are writing to urge you to include funding in the FY 2005 Agriculture Appropriations bill that would provide sorely needed increases in the National Research Initiative (NRI) and the restoration of 10% reductions made to CSREES base programs in FY 2004.


The funding for agricultural research continues to lag behind the levels provided to other national research initiatives. The National Research Initiative (NRI) - the nation's flagship agricultural research program - is able to fund only 15 percent of priority research that has already been examined by experts and deemed of high quality by peer review panels, whereas the National Institutes of Health and the National Science Foundation typically are able to fund more than 30 percent. Many of the nation's great agricultural research institutions are also threatened by the fiscal crises of their home states. At the same time, our nation faces many critical agricultural research needs, including food safety and security, health and nutrition, and the environment. To address these critical research needs, we urge you to include not less than \$180 million for the NRI. This is consistent with the President's budget request.


The FY 04 Omnibus Appropriations law made across-the-board 10% reductions to 33 line items that are funded by the Cooperative State Research Education and Extension Service (CSREES). Many of these programs are critical to the needs and well being of our citizens. As an example, currently there is an epidemic of obesity in this country yet cuts to the Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program have caused the layoff of hundreds of Extension staff that educate low-income families on the benefits of proper nutrition. The 10% cut also affected the IR-4 program that is designed to assist in the development of environmentally safe and effective pesticides for minor use crops. The FY 04 cuts are already affecting the availability of products in the market. We ask you to restore the 10% reductions for these 33 programs.


